Awarded the prestigious Westminster medal and prize for her first proof-of-concept work on the [capsule sponge](#) and associated assays for diagnosing Barrett's oesophagus in 2004, the device is now undergoing clinical trials.

The focus of her research group is to improve methods for early detection of oesophageal cancer through better understanding of the molecular pathogenesis.
